Dear Parkman Township Resident:

Over the years, there have been a number of incidents of breast cancer among women living on Forgehill and Stagecoach in Grand River Estates I in Parkman Township, Ohio. This concern caused two residents, Judi Shemitz and Sandy Denman, to contact the Ohio Department of Health, and request an investigation. The Ohio Department of Health, working with the Geauga County Health Department, has agreed to evaluate the available information regarding these incidents of breast cancer and determine what further steps, if any, should be taken by the health department as a result of their review.

The first step in this process is to gather as much information as possible about incidents of cancer in Grand River Estates I and the immediately surrounding area in Parkman Township. If you, or someone you know, lives or has lived in this area over the past 25 years and has experienced cancer of any type, and you are willing to share this information for evaluation by the Ohio and Geauga County Health Departments, please send a letter providing as much information as possible to:

PO Box 566, Parkman, Ohio 44080.

The information you send should include name, age, specific type of cancer, diagnosis date, treatment, current cancer health status, where and when you lived in Parkman, where you are living now, and phone number.

PLEASE NOTE: Any information you provide will be reviewed and compiled by Judi Shemitz and Sandy Denman. Your information will be shared with the Ohio Department of Health and the Geauga County Health Department, and may be shared with other agencies in the course of their evaluation. By volunteering your cancer history information, you are agreeing to have this information shared for any purpose related to this review.



Parkman Zoning Inspector

Back in August of 2008, the zoning commission adopted regulations regarding driveways in all zoning districts. I want to highlight a couple of the regulations that I seem to get the most questions on.

A driveway in a residential zoning district shall be set back a minimum of 3 feet from the nearest side and rear lot lines, measured in a perpendicular fashion from from the lot line to the edge of the driveway, shall be constructed of a durable all-weather surface, and shall be a minimum of 12 feet in width.

A driveway in a commercial or indistrial zoning district shall be set back a minimum of 3 feet from the nearest side and rear lot lines, measured in a perpendicular fashion from from the lot line to the edge of the driveway, shall be constructed of a durable all-weather surface such as concrete or ashphalt and shall be a minimum of 14 feet in width.

If a driveway exceeds 600 feet in length, measured along it's centerline beginning at the public road right of way, then it shall have a pull off space equal to twice the minimum width of the driveway. A pull off shall be constructed for each additional 600 feet of driveway length.

YOUR FIRE DEPARTMENT IS CHARGED WITH PRESERVING THE LIFE AND PROPERTY OF THE RESIDENTS AND THE VISITORS TO THE TOWNSHIP. TO DO THIS WE MAIN-TAIN A FLEET OF SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL. WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO DO THIS FOR APPROXIMATELLY THE LAST 20 YEARS WITHOUT ANY ADDITIONAL LEVIES TO THE TAXPAYERS. THIS TOTAL GEAR COST IS WELL OVER \$4000.00. THE FIRST NEW FIRETRUCK I REMEMBER THE TOWNSHIP PURCHASING AFTER I JOINED WAS WELL UNDER \$50,000.00 THE NEWEST ENGINE WE HAVE PUR-CHASED WAS GETTING VERY CLOSE TO \$370,000.00.
