We have presented a plaque to Bernice Wells, sister of Jeannette Smith Loomis, to honor Jeannette's service for our 2020 Memorial Day Celebration.

We had to cancel the parade due to the COVID-19 virus and social distancing requirements. Please let this in no way diminish the memorial of all who have and those who continue to serve this great country.

Parkman has had many who have gone before us who have given everything in service of their country, please pause to remember them all. May God rest their souls and give peace and honor to the families of all of them.

Going forward thru this 'pandemic' the trustees are currently having one meeting on the first Tuesday of each month and we are trying to streamline these as much as possible. PARKMAN MEMORIAL DAY 2020 TRIBUTE TO

JEANNETTE SMITH LOOMIS

Jeannette Elizabeth Smith Loomis was born in Parkman, Ohio on January 14, 1923. The 5th of 7 children, she was one of the 6th generation of Smiths to live in Parkman. She graduated from Parkman High School during World War II and on July 27, 1944, unknown to her parents, she took a Greyhound Bus from Parkman to downtown Cleveland to enlist in the United States Army Women's Army Corp. (WAC) Although they were later very proud of her for her service, they were very distressed at the time since her two older brothers had been



drafted and were serving overseas. Stanley was in the South Pacific and her oldest brother, Forrest was in Europe. He was killed in action December 1944 in France during the Battle of the Bulge.



Jeannette was first sent to Fort Des Moines, Iowa. While there she rose to platoon leader in Basic Training, she was later assigned to Crile General Hospital in Parma, a western suburb of Cleveland. Crile General Hospital was built by the U.S. Army and was named in honor of a renowned surgeon, Dr. George Crile, who was the founder of The Cleveland Clinic.

Trained by the Army as a medic, Jeannette cared for the sick and wounded soldiers at Crile and saw the horrific consequences of war up close and personal. Twelve hours a day, seven days a week, she worked the hospital wards and was soon transferred to surgery. There, she scrubbed alongside the nurses, preparing and sterilizing the surgical instruments. She saw countless cases of wounded men who had lost arms and legs and had horrific burns. She told of one who had burns over much of his body. There were no skin banks in those days and this young man desperately needed skin grafts. An appeal went out for skin donors, Jeannette was one of over 40 military personnel who volunteered to donate. After a selection, she was one of 16 who courageously submitted to the operation. The procedure was very successful and the young soldier healed and survived. Given only 10 days leave to recover, she had a large area of red skin on her abdomen for over 2 years. Jeannette was given a commendation by the commanding officer and an expression of thanks by the patient and hospital staff.

Jeannette told of many times she was able to laugh and joke in attempts to keep the wounded's hopes and spirits high. She said she was always proud to be able to help them. She continued to receive promotions and after the war ended she was given an honorable discharge with the rank of Sergeant T/4 on the 18th of November, 1946.



Shortly after being discharged from the Army, Jeannette visited her dentist, Dr. McIlroy, a longtime, well known dentist in Middlefield. When he learned of her nursing experience, he offered her a job as his assistant. She started the very next day and remained his assistant for many years, followed by a position with Drs. Ohanessian, Mayer and Ansari in Chardon. She married Willard Loomis, a teacher, June 26, 1966 and lived in Windsor in his historic home for many years.

Parkman residents, family and friends remember Jeannette's beautiful red hair and pretty smile. She was a 74 year member of Parkman Congregational Church and for many years was active in the Windsor United Methodist Church.

Having grown up on a farm, Jeannette always loved animals, especially her horses, dogs and cats. She also enjoyed gardening, flowers and was an excellent cook. She passed away at Briar Cliff Manor in Middlefield on September 22, 2016. After her service, full Military Honors were rendered at Overlook Cemetery in Parkman by American Legion Post 459.
