

Parkman Trustees Notes

From Lucinda Sharp-Gates

We thank the community for passing the road levy! As we answer calls about our roads we are reminded by our constituents that they helped to pass that levy and we are grateful.

We will never make up that five year deficit when we had to pull road maintenance money from our general fund. Passing the levy produces about \$96,000 a year for the five years of the levy but at the same time, costs have risen for gravel and material, diesel fuel and equipment and maintenance.

Our decisions are based on the allocation of the Township budgeted funds after review by the County Treasurer's office and the allocation of the limited manpower, Tom Evers, Ralph Kumher and Seth Wells, the latter two being part time or seasonal.

The maintenance of gravel roads which comprise 22 of the 27 miles of roads for which the Township is responsible is weather related. In the drier summer months the roads are hard and scraping them creates a dust challenge. Weather permitting the spring thaw and the fall rains create a softer road. That is when most of the road preparation is done and there is less dust. Dust control is provided by the brine companies. We call often, but they make the decision of where and when to go.

Soon Tom will be prepping the roads for what we all hope will be a gentle winter.

There is no panacea, no stimulus money for Townships, and only limited Issue Two money every few years. It's just us doing our best for the Township!

Chickagami Park Opens Soon

Many of you have, or know others who have, enjoyed the facilities and trails at Camp Chickagami on Tavern Road in Parkman Township. The property was owned and managed by the Boy Scouts of America, and used as a camping facility through much of the 20th Century. In 2003, to reduce operating costs, the Western Reserve Council sold the camp to Geauga Park District, who later named the property Chickagami Park.

After holding two public input meetings to gather ideas from area residents, a long-range plan was established. Following some restoration and clean up, two new group camp sites have been constructed, and will be opened for public reservations beginning November 1st. Each site contains a lean-to with fireplace, two tent pads, grill and fire ring. The scouts have continued to use the property since its sale, and will retain first rights to reserve the group sites each fall for the following year. Additionally the Boy Scouts have exclusive use of a few buildings on site.

Additional improvements will take place in Chickagami Park over the coming years, but for now you can enjoy hiking, camping and picnicking in the county's newest park. Its hard to believe summer is almost over. In the coming weeks we be out doing cracksealing on our paved roads. This usually takes about a week, weather pending. We are currently trying to finish up some ditching projects. Once the weather breaks we will begin to prepare the roads for winter. Just a reminder Fences are Not Permitted within the Road Right of Way.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO RESPECT OUR WORK ZONES . WATCH FOR MOVING EQUIPMENT and WORKERS . USE CAUTION WHEN TRAVELING THROUGH THEM.

Parkman Zoning Inspector

Please remember when applying for a zoning certificate to construct a new home or for an addition to an existing home to have a copy of the blueprints along with the other necessary documents. These prints, once approved will be stamped and then must be used to obtain the necessary building permits from the county.

Something new on driveways that has not been previously regulated through the zoning resolution. Driveways now must have a minimum setback from side and rear lot lines of three feet, measured in a perpendicular fashion from the lot line to the edge of the driveway. Driveways shall be constructed of a durable all weather surface, and shall have a minimum width of 12 feet.

There are other regulations that apply to driveways located near an intersection or a driveway that exceeds 600 feet. Please stop down to the zoning office and we can go over the complete specifics on driveways regulations.

Richard B. Pelmonter US Air Force 1960-1987

Rich attended Parkman School through 8th grade, then went to Cardinal (which at that time was called Middlefield High School). He excelled in athletics and became a valuable player in track and football. In 1960, he set Geauga County oldest track record for the 100-meter dash and qualified for state. The day after he graduated from high school, Rich and several of his buddies enlisted in the United States Air Force.

After his basic training in Texas, Rich was assigned to the Air Weather Squadron and received training as a weather technician. He served with a unit of the Air Weather Service which provides weather information for military flight operations. He completed 37 months of combat duty in Vietnam and received Distinguished Flying Cross for aerial achievement in Southeast Asia. He was also stationed in Guam and Germany as well as many bases throughout the United States.

Military life agreed with him. He loved his country and loved what he was doing. He wore his uniform proudly and served his country honorably for 27 years, retiring in 1987.

He moved to Florida and spent his remaining years in Orlando. Rich died of cancer on May 24, 2003.

Thank you Mary Soltis for sending in this great story about your brother Rich and his dedication to serving our country. Sharing these stories with the Parkman community gives us a little history of our former residents. Parkman hosts a wealth of people who are dedicated in helping our town and country be a safe place to live.
