Thanks to all who participated with this 2009 survey. This was designed as a feedback item to help direct the future of our Parkman communications project. The goal was to give you an opportunity to reach me and help me make this newsletter an interesting read for all of you.

Out of 1300 newsletters that were sent out to our community, only 100 were returned and of those 100, only 55 of them actually had any input and shared opinions. The other 45 were opted to have just a return mailing address on it just to satisfy the 100 percent involvement that I was asking for.

This very low interest was disappointing, but valuable non-the-less. I expected some that would not take an interest, but it was a very staggering amount that had no interest to participate. Parkman Trustees Notes

From Pat Joyce

After the cold and snowy winter of 08-09, spring and summer are upon us. Things are going fairly well in our township. First we would like to recognize and thank our Road Maintenance Department for their hard work in keeping the township roads clear and passable throughout the winter. They will be continuing their road maintenance operations as they address the challenges that each new season brings. Some may have noticed trees being removed on the North end of Newcomb Rd. near the Middlefield/Parkman Border. This is in preparation for a road construction project that will include the widening of Newcomb road between Patch and Shedd roads. This project will be a cooperative effort between Parkman and Middlefield Townships, partially funded by issue 2 money. The Township has also recently purchased a used Gradall to improve its ditching capabilities.

Other road related issues that our residents may want to take note of: ODOT will be back with the contractor on Route 422 this spring finishing up the Construction Project East of Route 528. Much of the work will be cosmetic, berm work, landscaping, etc. They have indicated that some of the driveway culverts may be extended and some of the transition grades from the road to the driveway may be smoothed out. Also of note: The Trustees received notice in October of 2008 that ODOT had developed construction improvement plans for the purpose of replacing a box culvert approximately 2000 feet south of Patch Road on SR 168 (Tavern Rd). Due to the size of the box structure, SR 168 may need to be closed for a maximum of seven days to perform the work. A detour route has been developed as part of the site construction plans, which includes utilizing SR 700 and US 422 as the detour roads. Signage will be provided to assist the traveling public.



Parkman's Memorial Day parade and ceremonies will be here before you know it on May 25th. This year the Township will honor the Gotham brothers (John, Glenn, Leland, Carlisle, and Neil), who all served in World War II.

Memorial Day ceremonies begin @ 9:00am in Overlook Cemetery with a parade shortly after, culminating with a ceremony in the Lower Cemetery on Parkman Nelson Road.

We know that the photo was borrowed, but no one knows who was the one who borrowed this missing photo. So please be responsible and get the missing photo




back to any of the trustees right away so that the rest of the community can enjoy the entire collection of historical graduation photos from our Parkman High School Alumni.

Parkman Volunteer Fire - Soft Billing

SOME MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, IN A FRIENDLY MANNER, CALL ME CHEAP, BUT I HAVE ALWAYS MADE IT MY POLICY TO SPEND THE TAXPAYERS MONEY WISELY. IN THE PAST FEW YEARS WE HAVE BEEN LOOKING AT WAYS TO IMPROVE THE FINANCES FOR THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. WE HAVE IN THE PAST APPLIED FOR VARIOUS STATE AND FEDERAL GRANTS. SOME WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO OBTAIN AND OTHER WE HAVE NOT.

WE ARE NOW LOOKING AT ANOTHER WAY THAT MAY HELP WITH OUR FINANCES. WE HAVE FOR MANY YEARS BILLED NON RESIDENTS FOR EMS SERVICES AND ARE CONSIDERING A CHANGE TO THAT POLICY. IN MANY AREAS OF THIS COUNTY AND STATE EMS SERVICE IS NOT FREE. MANY FIRE DEPARTMENTS, BOTH TOWNSHIP AND CITY, HAVE INSTITUTED A SYSTEM CALLED SOFT BILLING. UNDER THIS SYSTEM, ALL EMS TRANSPORTS WOULD BE BILLED TO A THIRD PARTY, MEANING INSURANCE COMPANIES. AT NO TIME WOULD AN INDIVIDUAL RECEIVE A BILL FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OR OUR BILLING COMPANY. THERE ARE TWO SCHOOLS OF THOUGHT ON SOFT BILLING.

THE FIRST IS THAT RESIDENTS (OR THEIR INSURANCES COMPANIES) SHOULD NOT BE BILLED FOR SOMETHING THEY PAY TAXES FOR AND THAT IF THE INSURANCES COMPANIES ARE NOT BILLED IT WILL KEEP THEIR COSTS DOWN AND THEY MIGHT NOT RAISE THEIR RATES. SINCE WE STATED BILLING NON RESIDENTS MANY YEARS AGO, I HAVE SUBSCRIBED TO THIS SCHOOL OF THOUGHT, BUT I HAVE HAD TO RETHINK THIS. I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM ANYONE WHO HAS HAD THEIR HEALTH INSURANCE RATE REDUCED OR EVEN STAY THE SAME FOR THE SAME COVERAGES. IN MY CASE, THE RATES I PAY AT WORK HAVE GONE UP ALL MOST EVERY YEAR, EVEN IF BENEFITS HAVE BEEN LESSENED OR DEDUCTABLES INCREASED.

THE SECOND SCHOOL OF THOUGHT IS THAT SINCE MOST PEOPLE ARE PAYING FOR HEALTH CARE INSURANCE AND SINCE THE RATES NEVER SEEM TO COME DOWN, WHY NOT BILL THIRD PARTIES (INSURANCE COMPANIES) FOR EMS TRANSPORTS. NO BILLING WOULD BE MADE TO INDIVIDUALS. WE HAVE TAKEN A PRELIMINARY LOOK AT THE POSSIBLER INCOME FROM SOFT BILLING AND FOUND THAT ON ONLY A 50% RECOVERY RATE FROM THE BILLING; WE MIGHT RECEIVE UP TO \$30,000.00 YEARLY. WITH AN AMBULANCE COSTING OVER \$80,000.00 WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO TAKE CARE OF REPLACING AN AMBULANCE WITHOUT ANY ADITIONAL COSTS TO THE TAXPAYERS. IT MIGHT ALSO ALLOW US TO HANDLE ADDITIONAL FUTURE COSTS WATEVER THEY MIGHT BE WITHOUT ADDITIONAL TAX LEVIES.

I WOULD LIKE YOU TO THINK ABOUT THIS POSSBLE CHANGE AND CONTACT YOUR TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES WITH YOUR OPINIONS. ANY CHANGE TO THIS BILLING POLICY HAS TO COME FROM THE TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES AND I AM SURE THEY WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR COMMENTS.
