### **Parkman Trustee Notes**

As trustees Pat, Nancy and I are charged with making sure that the necessary and required services are provided to the residents of Parkman. One of those services is fire protection. Parkman has a core group of very talented and dedicated fire department volunteers. Many of whom have served the community for 20 or more years. And although these individuals have always been willing to make the sacrifice of their time to help those in need, they aren't getting any younger. The number of new volunteers and the amount of time they are available to serve the community is a dynamic that has been changing for some time now. As a community we have finally arrived at the point that we need to be looking at alternatives to a completely volunteer fire department.

During the past year the trustees have been discussing what might be done to assure adequate fire and EMS services for our community. As you are aware Parkman and Troy have always had an automatic aid agreement with their fire and EMS services. What that means is that if one department was called both would respond, therefore assuring enough volunteers. This past year Troy township has hired individuals to staff their fire department during the busiest daytime hours. Because of this Troy no longer will provide automatic aid when Parkman gets a call. That has put Parkman in the position where the possibility exists that a daytime call may not get a timely response. Given enough time another neighboring department would respond if Parkman didn't. This is not acceptable in situations where minutes can be the difference between someone living or dying.

Our first attempt as trustees to address this issue is the implementation of a stipend program for our volunteers. We have allocated \$2000 per month to be paid to the volunteers who respond to calls. A system has been developed to assure the money is allocated fairly and responsibly. It is our hope that this stipend will encourage more participation from our volunteers.

Over the course of the next year we will be discussing other options such as hiring paid responders as well as sharing paid positions with Troy township. Input from our residents will help us to formulate a program that will be supported by all those who are affected. If you have suggestions or would like to be involved in the future planning of our fire department please come to one of our board of trustees meetings or contact Pat, Nancy or myself to discuss this more.

### Parkman Zoning Inspector

John Hasman -Parkman Township Zoning Inspector

Driveways in a residential zoning district shall be setback a minimum of three feet from the side and rear lot lines measured in a perpendicular fashion from the nearest lot line to the edge of the driveway. They shall be constructed of a durable all-weather surface and be a minimum of twelve feet in width.

If a driveway exceeds 600 feet in length, measured at its centerline beginning at the public road right-of-way, then it shall have a pull-off space equal to twice the minimum width of the driveway. A pull-off shall be constructed for each 600 feet of additional driveway length.

Other driveway regulations may apply. Please contact the zoning inspector for a complete listing of all the driveway regulations.

These are two important regulations due to the fact that emergency vehicles need to be able to reach the home to provide services safely and effectively.

Also want to cover lot splits.

Due to recently enacted new subdivision regulations, the zoning inspector must approve and stamp all lot splits within the township prior to the resident contacting the Geauga County Planning Commission for their approval.

Please contact the zoning inspector prior to any actual surveying takes place to make sure the split can be approved. In the end this will save you time and money. If the split cannot be approved, suggestions can be made as to how to best split a property while staying within the boundaries of the Parkman Zoning Resolution.

Office hours are every Wednesday evening from 7 - 8:30 PM, and the office is located at the rear of the Community House.

### **Parkman Township Volunteer Fire Department**

From Chief Wayne Komandt

It appears that we have all survived another year. We had a total of 374 incidents this year. There were 19 building fires, 10 chimney fires, 4 vehicle fires, 8 grass or trash fires,8 unauthorized outside burning, 39 motor vehicle accidents, 186 other EMS type calls and the balance of other miscellaneous type calls.

At the fire department this year, we have obtained various pieces of new equipment in various ways. We purchased a "Lucas Automatic and Portable CPR Machine" at a cost of about \$15,000.00. We purchased numerous sets of EMS protective gear for our more active EMS people at a cost of approximately \$3,000.00. We obtained a "RAD 57' SPO2/ CO monitor from University Hospitals which would have cost us over \$3000.00. We received a new "4 gas monitor" from the Geauga County EMA who obtained them for the fire departments in the county. It would have cost us over \$500.00.

In July we received an EMS grant of \$5000.00 from the state of Ohio and have started spending it on new batteries for our Aden's, backboard straps, and other small miscellaneous items. In April we applied, along with numerous other department, jointly for an "Assistance to Firefighter Grant" to purchase new radio equipment. This was done because in the very near future, due to some government directives and the age of our county radio system, our current radios will cease to work. This grant, if received will give us in Parkman Approximately \$90,000.00 and we will have to match it with approximately \$9,000.00. We are currently still waiting to find out if we will received the grant. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents and voters of the township for your continued support. Without that support we could not continue to do our job for you. We also make this promise to you. That if you need us just call 911. SOMEONE WILL COME


