Parkman Trustee Notes

Thankfully winter is over, spring is here and summer is fast approaching. There are many things happening in and around the Township. Presently, Parkman Township is monitoring the proposed State budget. It is possible that Parkman, like many townships, will be losing up to 50% of its local funding from the State over the next two years. We are estimating that to be around \$32,000 lost annually after the second year of cuts. This amount could go up or down as we learn more about the proposed reductions in local funding by the State. We will be keeping a close eye on this proposal. The business of serving our residents however, must go on.

The Road Department endured a harsh winter and now needs to turn its attention to prepping the roads for the summer. We have done quite a bit of research on dust control products and will be testing these in the coming months. Our main dust suppressant is calcium chloride. This year we will test a product called Road Kill which is soy based. We hope to be also testing at least two other products: Durablend, which is a magnesium chloride product and lignosulfonate, which is a natural polymer derived from wood pulp. We are looking to improve effectiveness, coverage, environmental impact and cost.

Our solar project that we began last fall, at the Community House, is nearing completion. Forty five panels were installed on the south facing roof of the Community House and are estimated to provide about a third of the electricity that the building annually utilizes. At present, the energy produced by these panels is considered to be renewable. Since the energy is renewable, the Township can sell what are called renewable energy credits to the highest bidder. Speaking of the Community House, we have made and scheduled several improvements at the Community House: a heater was installed and drywall work was done in the new edition portion of the basement; the bench, chairs and rockers in the 1st floor meeting room are being repaired and refinished; the kitchen stove was replaced and two fryers and a convection oven were added; we have drywall and finish work scheduled for the upstairs enclosed fire escape; we are in the process of getting estimates for painting.

Several months ago the Township participated in a voluntary Public Employment Risk Reduction Inspection at the Parkman Community House, Township Garage and Fire Department. Several recommendations were made to promote a safe and healthy workplace. We are currently taking steps to implement those recommendations.

Parkman Township has decided to bring back a community trash day to coincide with the tire recycling day. This event will be held on Saturday June 18th from 8:00am till 12:00pm. We will not be accepting batteries, liquid paint, chemicals, yard waste, rocks, dirt, concrete, and cement. We will also not accept items containing Freon, oil, gasoline or asbestos.

Don't forget about the Memorial Day Ceremony and Parade Monday May 30th, 9:00am @ Overlook Park. Last year we honored Veteran Albert Wilson and this year our Memorial Day Honoree will be Harold Blackford.

Last but not least, mark your calendar for the Community Picnic Saturday July 16th 5pm till 8pm @ Overlook Park on SR 168.
