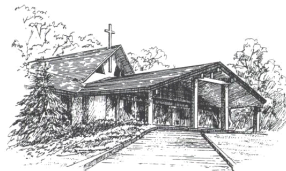

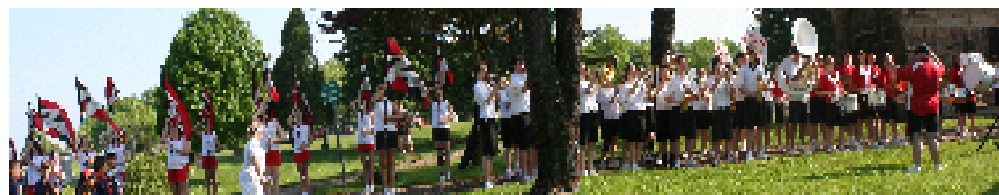
## Halloween Wagon Rides

## Parkman Volunteer Fire and EMS

As we approach the fall and winter months there are a few items I would like to remind all of you of.

1. The state of Ohio has a no burning regulation in effect. There are very strict limits on what and where outside burning is permitted. First, you must be 1000 feet away from any structure off of your property. Second, the smoke cannot obscure any roadway. Third, you can never burn garbage or petroleum products.
2. As we approach the heating season, be sure to have your furnaces checked. Also for those of you burning wood, PLEASE REMEMBER to check your chimney and clean on a regular basis.
3. As the snow starts to fly, remember our ambulance and fire trucks are wider than the normal car. PLEASE remember to have driveways and turn arounds cleaned of snow.

We hope that you never need us to your homes but if you do we will be there.

## Parkman Zoning Inspector

John Hasman - Parkman Township Zoning Inspector

Parkman Township has had specific driveway regulations for some time now and just wanted to again review them.

Driveways in a residential zoning district must be set back a minimum of 3 feet from the nearest side lot line measured in a perpendicular fashion from the edge of the driveway to the lot line. Driveways shall be constructed of an all weather durable surface and be a minimum of 12 feet in length.

If a driveway exceeds 600 feet in length, a pull off space equal to twice the minimum width shall be constructed. A pull off shall be constructed for each additional 600 feet in length. Please include the proposed driveway and its actual measurements and placement on your plot map that is submitted to obtain a zoning certificate.

Please contact the zoning inspector for driveway regulations in the commercial or industrial districts

Office hours are every Wednesday evening from 7 – 8:30 PM, and the office is located at the rear of the Community House.
