SAP'S-A-RISIN' - LET'S CELEBRATE!sweet tradition of history, public collection and free samples continues It's hands-on, educational, inspirational and celebrational!Bring your family and friends out to Geauga Park District's Sap's-A-Risin' for a taste of how maple sugaring has evolved since the Native Americans, then a taste of the sticky stuff itself.

Sap's-A-Risin'

Sunday, March 3, 10 and 17 – Noon to 4 p.m. Swine Creek Reservation, 16004 Hayes Road, Middlefield Township

Guests are always excited for this free experience: to enjoy historical interactions with costumed interpreters, gather sap during a stroll through the sugarbush, see and learn how sap is boiled in the sugarbuse's evaporator, enjoy a sample taste of syrup, then warm up in the lodge with live music, woodcarving demonstrations, maple stirs and maple popcorn. Geauga Park District's sugarbuse was built in 1983 on a 32-acre sugarbush thanks to the inspiration of former Park Board member Mark Sperry, a staunch believer in public education. This Genuine Geauga experience has become a memorable family tradition for many, drawing an average 400 people each day. For others, Sap's-A-Risin' has been known to change their entire outlook on March.

"Each day the lodge also features wood carving demonstrations and sales with Jim Stadtlander and Diane Harto, maple treats and live music: the New Deal String Band (old-time country and string band music) on March 3; Drake Hollow (country, blues and folk) on March 10; and Dave and Barb Partington (Appalachian and British Isles songs and tunes) on March 17.

Registration is not required for this all-ages program. The lodge, history trail and sugarhouse are fully wheelchair/stroller accessible, but sap gathering is off trail.




