Most of you already know that Kevin, Don, and I will not be seeking re-election. The residents will have the opportunity to participate in an historic election this fall and vote for new trustees. The Honorable Judge David L. Fuhry has agreed to swear in the new trustees at the end of the last Trustee meeting held on December 17, 2013 at the Parkman Community House. Please join us and be part of this event.

In other news, the Board by a majority approved \$88,000 for the purchase of a new F-550 Truck equipped with a snowplow and salt spreader for the Road Department. It should arrive next spring. The Board also approved putting on a Road levy and Fire levy this fall.

On October 22 at 7:00 pm, we will be having a joint meeting with the Zoning Board, Board of Zoning Appeals, and the Zoning Inspector at the Parkman Community House to review what they have been working on since our last meeting in April. The public is invited to attend.

Tired of driving to the Anthony Celebreeze Federal Building on E 9th Street, paying for gas and parking as well as the wear and tear on your car? There is a carpool that will be meeting in the center of Parkman, Monday - Friday who are looking for carpoolers to help share the expense.

The carpool originates in Niles, Ohio and plans to meet each day at 6 am and depart for 9th Street in the downtown area somewhere on Route 422 in Parkman.

Any one interested in joining must be a non-smoker, cologne free, be able to pass a background and driving record check.

The vehicle is a contract vehicle from VPSI, Inc. All maintenance on the van is paid by VPSI. The van rental, gas, and insurance cost is divided equally by the number of carpoolers depending on the price of gas and how many carpoolers participate. The more that join, the cheaper it will be.

Telework several days a week? Eighty percent of the carpool only go to Cleveland one or two days per week, so we have open seats. With prior planning, we can probably accommodate your work schedule.

I would like to first introduce myself. My name is Jim Clawson; I'm a paramedic / firefighter with the Parkman Fire Department. I reside in Parkman with my wife Toni who also is a paramedic on the department and our two sons, David (7) and Alex (5), future members of PTVFD! I have been involved in the fire service for over 14 years and have been a medic for 10 years. I have been on a handful of different departments, both paid and volunteer in which I gained valuable experience from all.

Joanie Dillon came to me in the beginning part of the year and asked if I would be interested in taking over her role has medical officer for the department. I graciously accepted the offer. Joanie has more than paid her dues and she deserves the chance to be able to kick back, relax and enjoy life without having to be available 24/7. Joanie, thank you for all that you have done and still are doing. With that being said, I know I have some big shoes to fill!

We have just recently put a new Lifepak 15 cardiac monitor in service on our squad, compliments of University Hospitals. This monitor has the latest technology available to pre hospital care providers. This allowed us to put our Lifepak 12 monitor on rescue engine 4222. In cases where we have two rescue calls at the same time, engine 4222 can respond with the ability of advanced cardiac monitoring. Mike Komandt and Courtney Sanders passed their EMT- Intermediate earlier this year. Our members are always continuing their education to provide the best level of service to the residents of Parkman.

My goals as the new EMS officer are to maintain the best equipped and trained professional staff for the needs of the residents of Parkman Township. The EMS field is evolving fast and the expectations of pre hospital care are advancing to the point where an ambulance is becoming an emergency room on wheels.

October 4th, Friday is our next Annual Fall Chicken Dinner. Hope to see as many of you there!







Parkman Volunteer Fire

Summer is over and fall is just beginning. Please remember that Ohio has very strict open burning laws and the burning of leaves is not permitted. If the Fire Department is dispatched to an open burning complaint, we are required to extinguish the fire if it does not meet the requirements of the open burning laws.



This November, Parkman residents will be voting on 3 vacancies for Trustee. I hope you all will exercise your voting privilege and get to the polls to cast your ballot. Remember it is your responsibility to choose the next group of Trustees. Don't take this responsibility lightly. Talk to the candidates. Find out what they believe are the important issues for your Township.

You will also have a tax levy to vote on for the Fire Department. If you look at the member of the Fire Department, you will find that most of them are residents of Parkman Township and property tax payers. This may well be the reason that when we spent tax monies for the Fire Department, we are very careful. We realize that spending your money in most cases is also spending our own money.

Your Fire Department has relied on the same tax income since 1984. This is almost 30 years. During that time we have been able to put aside, in a vehicle replacement fund, enough money to purchase two pumpers, a tanker, and a squad which are currently in service. With the price of Fire Apparatus constantly going up, this now requires us to set aside between \$80,000 and \$90,000 per year. It is getting increasing hard to do this with all the other costs associated with the Fire Service going up. When I started in the Fire Service over 35 years ago, the cost of outfitting a firefighter was about \$800.00. Now it is well over \$3000.00. We all know that the cost of fuel, insurance, electric and almost everything else has risen.

Please contact me if you have any questions about the Fire Department and I will do my best to answer them. Ask questions, learn the facts and become an educated voter and be sure to exercise your voting privilege in November.
