### **Parkman Trustee Notes**

The election for your trustees for 2014 proved to be very unusual. Ordinarily, the trustees are elected on a staggered schedule. Two would be up for election in one election year and the third would be up for election in the next election year. However, when one of the trustees resigned, that resulted in all three positions being voted on in the same election. Then, neither of the incumbent trustees decided to run so that meant that all three positions would be filled by new people. The election is over and the dust has settled. Your new trustees are Roger Anderson, Jon Ferguson, and Dennis Ikeler. We've only been working together for about a month and already we have developed a very positive rapport.

While each trustee is responsible for all of Parkman, we have structured the assignments into working groups. Each of the trustees will be the point man, or liaison, for each of the working groups. Roger is the liaison for the Community House and the Parkman Parks, Dennis is the Liaison for the Road Department and the Cemeteries, and Jon Ferguson is the liaison for the Fire Department and Zoning. This will streamline the information flow and problem resolution between the trustees and the different work groups. It will also help speed up communication when a resident has a concern. As a resident with a question or concern, you can contact any of the trustees but, contacting the liaison may speed up the process a little.

One of our first projects is to give our Community House a good dose of TLC. Roger is coordinating these activities. First, we need to give it a good, deep cleaning. Roger has organized two volunteer days and has asked our residents to help us do the basic deep cleaning. The first Volunteer Day was January 25th. In spite of near zero temperatures, six inches of snow and howling winds, we still had a few hardy volunteers show up and really got quite a bit accomplished. Thanks to all of you that helped! The next Volunteer Days are scheduled for February 21st & 22nd from 8am to 4pm, so we can be looking our best for the traditional pancake breakfasts. As the next step in the process, Dennis is pulling together some rough costs on renovations for the restrooms.

Elizabeth Sanders is our new Community House Coordinator. Elizabeth is responsible for scheduling the Community House and the Pavilion as well as the basic maintenance. Her phone number for scheduling purposes is 440-313-1834. She has also set up an e-mail account for scheduling, if you'd prefer to schedule using the internet. To make the information a little more accessible, the guidelines for using the Community House and the current rental fees have been added to the ParkmanOhio.com web site.

Through the efforts of the Geauga County Engineer's office, Parkman has received a grant to pave several of our roads. These roads are long past due for re-surfacing and are in obvious need of attention. The grant will pay for 80% of the paving cost up to a total grant limit of \$80,000. The roads being considered by the grant are Church, Center, Edwards, West Park, West, and Mill. The County Engineer's office will initiate the bids in late March. Once the bids are completed, the trustees will have to determine how much of the cost our budget will be able to fund. A special "Thank You" goes out to the Geauga County Engineer's Office for their efforts in making this grant available.





## Parkman Volunteer EMS

Now that 2013 is behind us, we look forward to year 2014. We had some members further their education on the E.M.S. side of things of the fire department. FF Eric Mathews completed his EMT-B (Basic) class and is

going through the process of obtaining his certification. FF/EMT-B Kelly Dale is working on becoming an EMT-A (Advanced). FF/EMT-P (Paramedic) Stacey Raymond has become a CPR instructor. Parkman has two certified CPR instructors now, Kelly Dale and Stacey Raymond, who both will be putting together an aggressive CPR instruction program. Anyone can learn CPR – and everyone should! Sadly, 70 percent of Americans may feel helpless to act during a cardiac emergency because they either do not know how to administer CPR or their training has significantly lapsed. This alarming statistic could hit close to home, because home is exactly where 88 percent of cardiac arrests occur. Put very simply: The life you save with CPR is mostly likely to be someone you love. More information to come in the future on classes and availability.

We recently put an I-pad on squad 4251, which will enable our responders to enter information into our electronic database while on scene. For the past several years, the fire department gets an E.M.S. grant from the State of Ohio. We just recently purchased several new pieces of equipment and supplies for the squad with funds from this grant. This grant helps keep us from using Twp. tax based funds for required purchases and trainings.

One of our biggest goals for 2014, is to implement the "Vial of Life" program in Parkman. You may be wondering what this is. Imagine that you have a medical condition or multiple conditions. You have fallen terribly ill and call 911. When we arrive, we will ask several series of questions to determine our treatment for you. Just for example, past medical history, current medications, allergies, name, date of birth, who is your Doctor, etc. The Vial of Life is simply a form that you would already have filled out with all this very important information that we are seeking. This form would then go in a plastic bag and get hung on your refrigerator. There are also two decals, one that goes on your entry door which alerts us that you are participating in the program, and one that goes on the bag. The Vial of Life is a nationally recognized program that several E.M.S. agencies and fire departments are adopting. More information can be obtained by going to www.vialoflife.com.

We recently changed our policy in regards to transporting to other hospitals. We used to only transport to UHHS Geauga. We are now in the final stages of completing all the steps allowing us to be able to transport to Trumbull Memorial & St. Joseph Medical Center in Warren, and Robinson Memorial in Ravenna. This will allow more options for the twp. residents who need to be transported to the emergency dept. We will still use Geauga as our primary first choice for emergency transports, as this is the closest facility to us. Ultimately, the crew will decide if the patient is stable enough for transport to one of the other facilities.

## Parkman Connections - 2014 Plant Swap

5th Annual Plant Swap is on Saturday, June 7, 2014 (1pm) at the Parkman Community House This is a <u>free</u> community event - welcome to all to participate!

#### Please bring:

1. Your plants to trade. Most of the plants at the plant swaps in the past have been perennial plants, but any plant is welcome: perennials, annuals, vegetable plants, house plants, shrubs, or tree seedlings.

2.Newspapers and/or a tablecloth to cover the table in front of you and for wherever you set down your plants. Our goal is to make cleaning-up easy.

3. The beverage of your choice, especially if it's a hot day.

#### How many plants should I bring?

There is no minimum number of plants that you need to have in order to participate. If you have several plants to share, that's great! Some people bring lots of one kind of plant to share with everyone. If you have just one or two special plants to swap, that's great too! People who start plants from seeds often bring several of their seedlings to share. People who divide their plants often have just one or two of a particular plant to share. We will be very happy to see you and whatever plants you can bring with you.

#### How should I prepare my plants?

Each plant should be potted in a container of some sort. The word "container" doesn't necessarily mean a regular plant pot. Feel free to use whatever you have on hand. Paper cups or plastic containers from food products (such as sour cream or cottage cheese containers) are fine. The plants will be replanted in their new homes, and the containers will be discarded anyway.

If you are dividing some plants that have a large ball of roots, and you don't have a container to fit them, you can use plastic bags. Dig up the plants along with plenty of soil around the ball of roots, and put each plant into a separate plastic bag. Tie the top of the bag around the root ball to keep the soil contained.

Each plant should be labeled in some way. You can write the information on the side of each plant container with a marking pen, or you can use a plant tag. Examples of plant tags would include wood craft sticks, plastic strips cut from milk jugs, or whatever you have on hand that could serve as a plant tag. The name of the plant is the most important thing to include, if you know the name of the plant. With the name on the label, people who take your plant home can look up other information about the plant. If there is other information that you think is important, add that information too. Examples: Sun or shade? Moist soil or dry?

## **Parkman Volunteer Fire**

As I write this article in January 2014, I have to look back over 2013 and forward into the New Year. Last year your fire department sponsored a firefighter class called Firefighter 1. This class is over 140 hours of instruction. The majority of our volunteer firefighter had only taken the basic firefighter class which consists of 36 hours of instruction. I am very proud that Jeremy Miller, Russell Spenser, Jim Baril , and Timmy Czacherski , along with myself ,completed this class and are now certified as Firefighter 1.

In 2013 we responded to just under 1 incident per day. Actually the average was .9 incidents per day. We transported patients over 100 times. We recorded no fire deaths. We passed a replacement fire levy and were able to respond to our incidents in a safe and professional manner without causing any injuries to our members or major damage to any of your fire apparatus.

We look ahead in 2014 to sponsoring another Firefighter 1 class to better the certifications of more of our members and get some of cadets certified as firefighters. I am also starting a new project for the residents. Firefighters know that the major cause of fire deaths in the U.S. is smoke. I am this year going to look for a source of funding that would allow us to put a smoke detector in every inhabited residence in the township. With any luck we can find this funding somewhere.

My biggest concern is our ability to respond to your emergencies. We have many highly trained and dedicated people on your fire department. We have others that may not be as highly certified but just as dedicated and others that might not be quite as dedicated. The certifications and dedication is not the problem. The real problem is that Parkman is a bedroom community meaning residents live here but work elsewhere. People are just not at home during weekdays. They are away working and this is also true of my firefighters. Almost all have full times jobs and many extra part time work schedules. Because of this our ability to respond is sometimes compromised. Rest assured that if you dial 911 for a fire or medical emergency, someone will eventually show up. It may not be a Parkman Firefighter or EMT and there might be a delay. Because of this possible lack of appropri-



ate response, we will be looking at what we can do to solve this.
