Looking back to January when we took office it seems like years have passed. In eight short months we have had a whirlwind of decisions to make and still have many more.

Some that have been made: We agree to have different viewpoints and still find common ground.

We have continued along the prior path and received the new truck and have paved some roads in the center of town. We have developed job descriptions and review documents for our employees.

We have cleaned the Community House, Overlook Park and continued reorganizing our Fire and Road departments to permit better service and more functional management.

We have filled the vacancies of: Zoning Secretary, Community House Coordinator, Road Department Worker, various Zoning positions and Fiscal Officer all of whom resigned prior to or on our term.

Some decisions that remain: How can we insure Fire and EMS service without tax increases? How can we maintain and improve our roads within a reasonable budget? How do we provide all these services with an ever decreasing income flow? And the list goes on forever.

Some firsts: The current Board of Trustees are the first total board replacement since the very first board.

We are the first Board to have an offsite meeting at an Amish School House and attempt to take the meeting to the people, quite successful I might add and looking forward to doing this again maybe in October.

We have begun work on a five year spending plan and a budget that is realistic.

We have developed a liaison responsibility that permits faster functionality with decision making and reporting and allows each of us to focus more on specific areas of concern without waiting for a meeting for a decision.

We invite all of you to come out for a meeting to see for yourselves what is new and different and to offer your opinion.

## **Parkman Volunteer Fire**

I started this issues article with intentions of reminding you of the same things I did over the last couple of years about open burning and safety during the winter months. Then I realized after going to a County Fire Meeting of something more important. Today is September 11 2014. During the meeting I attended tonight, I met and listened to a retired New York Fire-



fighter who was at home 13 years ago today, the day the World Trade Center Towers were hit by two airplanes and toppled. He had two brothers on the Fire Department working that day. Luckily, due to the gridlock on the roads neither of them got to the Towers before they collapsed.

I listened as he recounted briefly what had happened (as we all knew) but then he changed to thank us for the support for New York City. Not just for the Fire Department and the safety forces that had lost so many men, but for the entire city. He said that he could not have imagined getting thru what had happened without the help and support of all the people that helped. People who came from all over the USA. People who came on their vacations. People who flew to New York at their own expense to help clean up the rubble, to help sort thru the rubble by hand, to help find small parts and pieces of those who had died so their families could find some closure.

We need to remember what happened that day 13 years ago. We need to remember the devastation and anguish caused. We need to remember those in the Towers that died. We need to remember the Fire and Police and Rescue workers who ran in, while others were running out, and died.

But maybe we mostly need to remember that American's came together to help each other without requiring an invitation, recognition, or reimbursement.

"We will never forget"



They are intended for use by those that might have mobility problems and might not be able to get to the door during an emergency (especially medical emergencies). 

### Two Parkman diaries from Henrietta Johnson written in the early 1930's

Special thanks to Ken and Pat Bolek of Chardon for their kind donation to the Parkman Historical Society. Ken and Pat found a couple diaries written in the early 1930's from Parkman Resident Henrietta Johnson, wife of Volney and mother of Earl. The diaries were written for the years 1932 and 1933 and hold many pieces of information making reference to the Buckeye Band (which both Volney and Earl were members), the hard times of the depression, the opening of the new stadium in Cleveland when the League Park was closed, the stealing of the Lindburg baby and so much interesting material about life in the 1930's.

It is almost complete with the exception of a month or so when Mrs. Johnson was ill. With a little investigating Ken and Pat found that the family is all buried in the Overlook Cemetery. Also Thanks to Joanne and Ken Podany for their help to contact us about this historical treasure.

## Parkman Volunteer EMS

Fall is fast approaching and the time for trying to stay warm is near. As every one is starting their furnaces and wood burners up, the risk of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning increases. Carbon monoxide is an odorless, tasteless, and colorless gas that is known as the "silent killer". The Centers for Disease Control estimates that CO poisoning claims nearly 400 lives, and causes more than 20,000 emergency room visits annually. CO is produced by common household appliances. When not properly ventilated, carbon monoxide emitted by these appliances can build up.

Symptoms of CO poisoning such as headaches, nausea, and fatigue, are often mistaken for the flu because the deadly gas goes undetected in a home. Prolonged exposure can lead to brain damage and even death.

The best way to prevent CO is to properly maintain your chimneys by keeping them clean which will also reduce your chance of having a chimney fire. Also have your gas or fuel burning appliances maintained to keep them working properly. The most important thing is to have a working CO detector in your home along with working smoke detectors. You can purchase these at any hardware store. If you have a detector in your home and it starts to go off and you are unsure if you have a problem, please call 911 and we will be more then happy to come out and check with our multi gas detector, and determine if you have a positive presence of CO in your home or if you have a faulty detector.

Our "File of Life" program is up and running. These are free to residents and will help our EMS responders in a time of an emergency, by providing your important medical history information.

We have two members who decided to pursue becoming EMTs. Tommy Baril and Danny Spencer are currently attending the EMT-B class. They will be great additions to the EMS team for Parkman Township.

### 2014 Parkman Memorial Day Honored William Carter Snyder 1923 – 2007

William Carter Snyder was born on July 18, 1923, in Youngstown, Ohio. Bill was inducted into the U.S. Army on July 19, 1943, at Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio. He attended Surgical Technicians School at O'Reilly General Hospital, Springfield, Mo before

going to the 31<sup>st</sup> General Hospital in the Pacific Theater. There he spent 14 months as a Medical Technician, six months as a Surgical Technician and six months as a Sergeant, non-commissioned Medical Officer, overseeing 164 men. He was discharged from the Army on March 18, 1946, receiving the American Theater Ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific Theatre Ribbon, Good Conduct Ribbon, and Victory Medal.



In 1956 Bill and his family built a home on Route 422 where his wife Charlotte still resides. Bill had served with Parkman Volunteer Fire Dept from 1951 to 1962 acting as Chief from 1955 to 1959. During this time he helped to build Parkman's first grass jeep. He and Charlotte were founding members of Parkman Chamber of Commerce, organizing Homecomings, Pancake Breakfasts, dances, and helped with the development of Overlook Park.


