Parkman Volunteer Fire

As many of you may know, I am currently under treatment for leukemia. I want to assure you that your Fire Department is in good hands with the Officers we have in place if I am there or not. These young men do an excellent job for you.



I have taken this excerpt for Fire Engineering (a fire service magazine) To remind you all for the need for fire safety.

"Every year in America, over 4000 people die and more than 20,000 are injured in fires. Statistically, that may not sound like very many, but if you've ever met a burn victim, you know that you want to do everything in your power to make your home safe, and prevent the possibility of a fire. Sadly, around 80% of fire deaths occur in homes. What's even sadder is that most of these deaths and injuries could have been prevented, with a few simple safety measures.

To keep your family safe from the risks of fire, you'll need to concentrate on four areas: education, prevention, detection, and response. You'll need to educate yourself and other family members on the fire hazards, you'll need to take specific steps to remove fire hazards from your home, you'll need to install and maintain smoke detectors, and you'll need to plan ahead on how to react in case of a fire, so that if the worst happens, you're prepared, and no one is injured or killed. If you cover all four of these bases, you'll greatly reduce your family's fire risk.

Many of these fire safety tips are common sense, and you've no doubt thought of and implemented some of them. Others may have slipped your notice, or you possibly were never aware of them. The good news is that most of them cost nothing, are easy to do, and don't take much time.

A lot of fire prevention lies in simply adopting some simple practices, and making them habits for your whole family. Of course, there may be some things specific to your situation that aren't covered here. It's unlikely, but it's possible. In that case, if you're worried about something in your home that we didn't mention, err on the side of caution. If you think something might be a fire risk, then change it, or do it differently, whatever the situation requires. You know your home better than anyone. So, if in doubt, it's better to be safe than sorry. Never was the cliche "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" as true as it is when it comes to fire safety."

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


Road Construction Alert

6th Annual Parkman Plant Swap

Saturday, June 6, 2015 at 1:00 PM.

The Parkman Plant Swap is held on the first Saturday in June at the Parkman Community House

Please bring:

Your plants to trade. Most of the plants at the plant swaps in the past have been perennial plants, but any plant is welcome: perennials, annuals, vegetable plants, house plants, shrubs, or tree seedlings. <u>Newspapers or a tablecloth</u>. Our goal is to make cleaning-up easy. The beverage of your choice, especially if it's a hot day.

How many plants should I bring?

There is no minimum number of plants that you need to have in order to participate. If you have several plants to share, that's great! The more, the merrier! If you have just one or two special plants to swap, that's good too. We will be very happy to see you and your plants.

How should I prepare my plants?

Each plant should be potted in a container of some sort. The word "container" doesn't necessarily mean a regular plant pot. Feel free to use whatever you have on hand. Paper cups or plastic bowls from food products (such as cottage cheese bowls) are fine. The plants will be replanted in their new homes, and the containers will be discarded anyway.

Each plant should be labeled in some way. Examples of plant labels would include wood craft sticks, plastic strips cut from milk jugs, or whatever you have on hand that could serve as a plant label. The name of the plant is the most important thing to write on your plant label. If you don't know the name of your plant, please include other information about the plant. Examples: Sun or shade? Moist soil or dry?

You may remember me mentioning in the fall EMS article that we have two personnel attending EMT-B class. It is with great pride that I announce Tom Baril and Danny Spencer passed their EMT and are functioning on the squad! I had no doubt in my mind that they would succeed. Congrats guys!!

Both Dale Komandt and Joanie Dillon announced their retirement from the fire department. Words cannot express my gratitude and respect for what they have contributed and sacrificed for the fire dept and for the community.

I am pleased to mention with the assistance from a grant through Ohio BWC (Bureau of Worker's Compensation), we are able to purchase a Stryker Power Load cot system. This cot loading system will make it possible for us to load patients safely into the back of the ambulance with simply a push of a button. This grant would not of been possible if it wasn't for all the hard work and many hours that Kelly Dale did on her own time writing and researching this. Thank you Kelly!!

We are in the early stages of replacing our ambulance. We have seen an increase of mechanical problems with our current squad over the last few years. Having a good mechanically running ambulance could be the difference between life and death. With good financial planning over the years we are able to replace it without having to raise taxes, which is always a good thing. I would like to share an EMS Poem with you. It is called Sorry - author unknown -

> Sorry if we woke you in the middle of the night, But someone in your neighborhood is fighting for their life. Sorry if we block the road and make you turn around, But there's been a bad wreck with dying children on the ground. When you see us coming I hope you'll understand, Let us have the right of way someone needs our helping hand. Sometimes a child is choking; sometimes a broken leg, Sometimes a heart stops beating and when we get there it's too late. So if you see us crying when we think we are alone, You'll know we had a bad one and we're feeling mighty down. We don't do it for the money you know we don't get paid, We don't do it for the glory but for life that might be saved. Somewhere deep within us our souls are crying out, We're here to help our neighbors in their hour of pain and doubt. God gave us something special to help us see you through, We do it because we love you and we care about you too.
