#### **Parkman Trustee Notes**

THANK YOU to everyone that voted to approve the 2 mil levy. As you know from past Parkman Paragraphs, we experienced a significant reduction in revenue starting in 2014 – mostly as a result in changes at the state level. This new levy will offset those losses. Thank you again for your support.

Maintaining the roads is one of our biggest expenses. Each year we put tens of thousands of dollars in gravel on the roads plus thousands of dollars in dust abatement only to turn around and do it over again the next year, and the next. We are trying to end that never ending cycle. We have been working with a company that has developed a dust suppressant that is environmentally friendly and also helps stabilize gravel roads. The material has proven effective in many areas throughout the country but not in our type of winters with the heavy snow and cold temperatures. This material has been spread on Newcomb Road and Nash Road. So far the results have been pretty good. The dust has been reduced and the roads are becoming more stabilized. The only problem left to be resolved is the road roughness. The manufacturer has been working with us to address this issue. Now, all that's left to do is to wait and see how the roads fare through our winter. If this proves to be a viable solution, gravel purchases can be greatly reduced and calcium chloride and salts can be completely eliminated, plus, we'll end up with better roads.

We were also able to chip seal Hobart Road this year. I know some were expecting asphalt but the cost of asphalt has become too expensive for most township budgets. For example, to pave Hobart with asphalt would cost almost our entire road budget. Where we can we are seeking grant money but many of our paved roads don't qualify for grant money so they will be chip sealed. This has been a common practice for some townships for years – Southington, for example.

Mike Komandt has been promoted to Chief and Jim Clawson has been promoted to Assistant Chief of the Parkman Township Volunteer Fire Department. Both men are extremely qualified for these positions not only from a technical standpoint but also because of their extensive experience. I look forward to working with them in their new assignments.

The part time daytime staffing that began a little over a year ago has proven to be very effective. The staffers are averaging about a one minute response time from the time that page is received to the time they are out the door. Our volunteers responding in the evening and on weekends are also doing a great job. They're averaging about six minute's response time and that includes the time it takes for them to travel to the Fire Station. I'm truly proud of our Volunteers and Staff and their accomplishments. In spite of these great results, I'm concerned. Most Fire Departments, especially those in rural areas like ours, are struggling to maintain and recruit volunteers. If you would like to become a Volunteer, or know someone who might want to become one, call the Fire Department at 440-548- 2515. We'll supply the gear and help with the training.

We are continuing our efforts to improve the appearance of our community. Earlier this year, the Trustees asked our Zoning Inspector, John Spelich, to begin addressing some of the worst examples that could use a little TLC. John has sent nearly 50 letters to residents asking them to address the junk and debris that has accumulated on their properties over the years. Most have responded very positively. Some will take a little more coaxing. This is not a zoning issue; instead it is covered by the Ohio Revised Code. We are also addressing junk vehicles and abandoned houses. These issues take longer to address but, since it's covered by the Ohio Revised Code, we have more latitude in resolving the problem. Parkman is our home; it's where we live. We need to treat it better!

Our Trustees' meetings are held the first and third Tuesdays of every month at 7:00 PM at the Parkman Community house unless a different location is posted. Come on down – we'd like to hear from you.

#### Parkman Volunteer Fire & Rescue

Your Fire Department is focusing on the safety of the businesses, visitors, and citizens of Parkman Township. Over the next few months, Our Fire Safety Inspectors will be out visiting local busi-

nesses and conducting Fire Safety Inspections to ensure the safety and well-being of the occupants of these facilities. When you see one of our 5 inspectors out, be sure to say "Hello". They are working to protect you.

It is once again fall, time for changing leaves, readying our property for winter, and getting ready for the snow. Please remember that it is ILLEGAL to burn leaves in the road side ditches. Any fires on your property to cause a nuisance to your neighbors due to the amount of smoke or smell being produced, type of material being burned, and the proximity to other buildings can be deemed illegal. The Fire Department will extinguish and must report to Law Enforcement any illegal fires reported to the Fire Department. The Fire Department does not go out looking for these fires to report.

If you have a wood burning stove, furnace, or other appliance in your home, please remember to have your chimney cleaned and inspected prior to beginning to heat your home or business this fall. Once you are using your heating appliances, please clean your chimney on a regular basis. Have smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors in your home, and never remove the batteries.

IF your chimney becomes plugged, home begins to fill with smoke, or you feel that the inside of your chimney may be on fire, CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY!!

Please do not try to put out a fire in your chimney, and DO NOT drop anything down your chimney in an effort to clean out debris from your chimney. The Fire Department has specialized equipment used to clean blockages and extinguish fires inside chimneys.

Parkman Fire Department is not a full time fire department and we rely on our volunteers to handle the majority of emergencies. We continue to work closely with Middlefield and Troy, and intend to do so well into the future.

Parkman Fire Department has responded to over 400 emergencies this year, and as always we appreciate the community and its continued support of the Fire Department.
