Let's get started about the roads this winter. As everyone knows the winter hasn't been very fun with all the rain and thawing and freezing. We have tried to apply stone and dragging the roads to help with all the holes and stability with all the rain. It seems to have helped and now that they will freeze that will help us keep up with them. We are planning on doing some ditching this winter once things freeze up. We have our Gradall repaired and that will help save some money this year. We are going to talk to Middlefield township to try to work together this year. We have other options also on road repairs that we are looking into. I know everyone has heard of the grant money that is supposed to pave Newcomb. That is not a done deal yet for sure but we are hoping it will and have that done in 2020. That project will be handled by the county engineers. Future notice please don't rake leaves into the ditches and burn them because that can plug drive pipes and crossovers. I would like to thank the Preston family for allowing us to store equipment in their barn again this year.

#### From: Roger Anderson

As for the Community House we have completed the update of the main floor restrooms and have begun work on the generator installation. To accomplish this, an additional gas line had to be installed at the west end of the building to accommodate the additional load that would be present. This will help complete the process for the Red Cross emergency shelter. This will also help in those times like Election Day when power failed in the area. We will be up and running no matter what. We will continue to update as time and budget allows.

Bookings are coming in at an increased rate and users of the Community House seem quite satisfied. There is a current price sheet on the ParkmanOhio.com website or you can call Meri Lynn for a price for your next event. Be sure to schedule early to assure you can get the date you want.

At Overlook Park we will finish the installation of the other two grills in the spring to be sure they are available for use. There are a number of reservations for the dates in the park already so as with the Community House schedule early to get the date you want.

Once again we will have a community Scrap and Tire recycling day on the Saturday before Father's Day which is June 15, from 8AM till Noon. We have been very successful with these events and have removed tons of garbage and tires from Parkman.

# Parkman Volunteer Fire & Rescue

The Parkman Fire Department has increased its staffing hours to 15 hours per day, seven days per week. The response time for all staffing calls is less than one minute from the time the call is received until the crew is out the door and on its way. The remaining nine

hours coverage still rely on volunteers and mutual aid. We are continuing to develop ways to share resources with other Fire Departments in our area. Chief Komandt is also continuing to evaluate ways to expand the coverage to a full 24 hours every day.

Five of our Fire Department staff have or are taking classes to become Paramedics. One has completed his course work and has passed the rigorous testing. Two are in the testing process, and two are currently attending classes and clinicals.

Chief Komandt has been very successful in obtaining grant funds for the Parkman Fire Department as well as many of the surrounding Fire Departments. The recent regional grant that was submitted was awarded over \$500,000. This award was split between several Fire Departments and was used to buy upgraded SCBA equipment. These types of grants are essential in offsetting the high costs of maintaining any Fire Department.

We are still struggling to enlist and retain qualified staff and volunteers. We are not alone. Most rural Fire Departments are facing the same issues. Parkman pays an hourly rate during the staffing hours and a stipend per call during the volunteer hours. We also provide the training and gear so, if you're interested in an exciting and rewarding job, or know someone who is, Call Chief Komandt at the station, 440-548-2515 or stop at the station and pick up an application.

Hi everyone, well believe it or not spring is just around the corner and if you're going to build a new house or add on the your existing house here are a few things to keep in mind.

If it is a new house lets say, and it is on a new lot (or parcel), make sure your new lot has been surveyed and you have a copy of the survey, if you have an exciting drive and that drive has an address verify thru the Geauga County Engineers office (phone call can get your information), if your parcel has no address then the County Engineers office can help you with an address. You might wonder why a street address? Well it is needed because when I go into the Auditors web site (real link) that is how I identify your parcel and your being the owner of that parcel.

When you call me (330-219-3698) for permit information the first question I ask you is your address and of course your name. When applying for a zoning permit have that information with you and the process is easy and quicker for me and you.

My Zoning office hours on Wednesday nights 4:40 PM to 6:00 PM and we are located in the rear of the community center on Main Market Road (Rt 422).

If you cannot make our hours then call me for another day or night, and if need be you give me a call (330-219-3698) and we get your permit for you.

Also keep in mind that you need 2.50 acres with at least a 200 foot frontage. We also offer "flag lots".

For the well being of Parkman Township if you see illegal dumping and or someone building with out a permit call ZONING.
