The trustees and zoning are working to continue to rid the Township of man made junk yards and junk motor vehicles under Ohio law 505.87 and house bill 560. This gives the Township the authority to order the property owner to clean up or the township may have a contractor provide the clean or removal of vehicles at the property owners expense and enter the total expense on the tax duplicate. A copy of the aforementioned Ohio laws is available at the zoning office in back of the Community House.

Parkman Trustee Notes

Overlook Park - From Henry Duchscherer

We have revitalized Overlook Park this summer with help from the community. Norman Bender and his crew donated the labor and re-roofed the dugouts and pavilions. Steve Schwendeman and his crew reclaimed the ball diamonds which had been taken over by weeds. Rod Zeigler donated fencing for a drag for the fields and helped plan the new sand volleyball court. Alan Yoder has been contracted to paint the pavilions and dugouts and the Road Garage. We resurfaced the tennis and basketball courts and put up a new tennis net and fixed the rims on the backboards. We also purchased tennis equipment and a basketball for when people rent the park. We put in a huge sandbox which doubles as a sand volleyball court with a new heavy-duty net. We put down new mulch on the playground and put in new hitching post in the shade by the front ball field. We have two new BBQ grills. Dennis Ikeler made a great Corn Hole set. We are planning to add a football, frisbee and sandbox toys. If anyone would like to donate any gently used sports equipment let us know.

Community House - From Henry Duchscherer

The generators are installed so we won't have interrupted elections and also have a place to go if a disaster strikes. We are moving the Recycling Bins to behind the Community House and are adding security cameras.

Fire Department - From Roger Anderson

We have been staffing 15 hours a day 7 days a week but have still had some calls missed by our staff due to the fact they were after hours. These calls go to volunteer or mutual aid and response times are somewhat longer. We feel it is necessary to staff 24/7 to cover all the hours and improve response times. With great deliberation and discussion we have determined that the best way to accomplish this would be to make an addition to the current station for sleeping quarters for our staffers and also additional storage, office space and to be able to have an area for training and other functions. To make this project also worth while we have determined it would also be best to have a paramedic available to staff each shift. To guarantee this was possible we decided it would be best to have 3 fulltime paramedics and support these with the part time staff we currently have. Factoring in all the needs and costs we will be placing a 5 mill levy on the March ballot. We will be scheduling public meetings to explain this plan and answer any questions regarding our thoughts. Please attend any one of these meetings and also please vote.

Road Department - From Dennis Ikeler

Let's get ready for winter. This summer the road department was very busy with some major projects. They had a major drain pipe issue on Mill St. They also had to replace a catch basin by the church to help flooding on Center St. along with some major ditch work at the end of Church St. They also have a big job on Soltis Rd. replacing a crossover pipe. We got an early start grading and dragging the roads this year and got them sprayed for dust. We will not be able to spray this fall because of budget restraints. We will be ditching more this fall once the bigger projects are done. We are holding off on grading and dragging the roads until we get some rain to help with dust. We promoted Eric Mathews to road superintendent to help get the projects and issues addressed sooner. I will still be in on the issues and help organize them. One big issue this fall is for the residents please don't rake leaves into the ditches to help prevent plugged drive way pipes. We understand everyone wants to get rid of the leaves but this is a big problem, thanks. Just so everyone knows the road department also takes care of funerals for the township and this takes up some of their time. This is a benefit for the township instead having to pay a contractor. We are going to get a phone for the superintendent for access to the road department during the day instead of leaving messages during the day while they are working. Have a great fall and winter.

What a wonderful summer we have had! As it comes to an end and we transition into the cooler, then outright COLD winter months, the Fire Department would like to remind everyone of a few things this fall/winter:

Please clean and inspect chimneys prior to burning in your fireplaces, stove, or furnace.
Leaves should not be burned this fall. If the Fire Department receives a complaint, we must
respond to that complaint and investigate.
Open burning is NOT allowed anywhere in the State of Ohio. Small fires are permitted but must
not contain any materials that will make large amounts of smoke. If it makes black smoke - you
can NOT burn it!
Please clear your driveway and address sign so in the event of an emergency we can find you

and get to you.

In 2019 we have added a few more members to the department. Most of our new members travel a great distance to come to work at Parkman.

Fire/Medic Baker, Fire/Medic Dubravetz, and FF/EMT Alvarez are all from the Akron area. FF/EMT Stern came to us from Farmington and shares his time between Paramedic School, Farmington, and Parkman. We welcome these gentlemen to Parkman!

In the same time, we have seen 4 members obtain Full time employment with other fire departments in Northeast Ohio. We wish these men well in their fulltime career.

This fall the Township has TWO fire levies on the ballot for RENEWAL. These two levies are integral in providing funding to have personnel available to respond to emergencies. During the 15 hours that members are in the station each day, we respond to all emergencies within 1 minute! This is extraordinary response time compared to other departments. This is due to our personnel being in the station ready to respond. I hope to be able to continue and expand on the hours that Parkman personnel are in the station and ready to respond. We can not do this without the support of YOU — the voters- The VOICE of the township. The Members, Officers, and I thank you for your past and continues support of the Fire Department.
