

Parkman Trustees Fall 2020 Review

Well I guess we all know that 2020 has been a very different year for all. We have had tons of confusion, changes and different directions on a daily basis. I certainly hope that everyone has proceeded to a new level of comfort and we can get past this time of uncertainty. I also hope everyone has filled out the CENSUS information if not please do it soon. This information helps the township with funding and representation. Going forward we still have a variety of items that are still in the (wait and see) stage.

Some updates: We will definitely have in person voting at the Community House on November 3. The Board of Elections has made some modifications so that 'social distancing' and sterile options are maintained. YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO WEAR A MASK. Early voting and absentee are still options that are available, vote early for these options to make sure your vote is counted.

We will sterilize the Community House before and after voting to insure safety. There is a renewal road levy on the ballot. **PLEASE VOTE**!!!

The Board of Trustees is still discussing the best solution for the fire department. We all agree that 24 hour coverage is definitely needed to provide a proper level of safety for our residents, how we achieve this with a plan that is sustainable is a continuing discussion. We will have a fire levy on the ballot in the spring. Please attend a trustee meeting soon to input your feelings as to what should be the future of Parkman Fire & Rescue.

The Post Office should be returning soon to the center of town in the BP lot, although they don't seem to be in any hurry. The BP construction should also be done and a new flow there. The Gazebo will be getting a much needed paint job as well as the front of the Community House. Please stay safe and healthy in the upcoming fall and winter months.

Parkman Roads

From Superintendent Eric Mathews

Hello, I hope everyone has been able to enjoy the beautiful weather we are having this summer. I would like to give just a basic rough agenda as far as the plans for the roads. FIRST I would like to thank those of you who have been understanding and left us messages with positive feedback when we are able to get to and maintain your roads. This year has been tough because even though the weather was beautiful the heat was not so friendly to us in regards to our dust control on the dirt roads. The material that was applied is activated by moisture which then gives the road the wet look and knocks the dust down. Unfortunately we do not have a water truck or an effective means of watering the roads and it hurt us this year between no moisture and the multiple days and weeks of high temperatures early this summer. As some of you may have notice we have been fighting washboard on the roads all season this year.

We have had a couple major road projects that we had to complete and we have been trying to maintain the roads in between. As far as the dirt road residents we are starting to use asphalt grindings on the roads now. We tested this three years ago on Patch road and although it will still produce dust in high heat we noticed the amount of holes and dust cut down significantly.

The week of 8-31 thru 9-4 we will be finishing our last major road project and will return our focus on attempting to have the roads prepared for the fall and winter season. This will include lightly grading and dragging (while the roads are wet), spreading grindings and or gravel where needed, full road side mowing from the road edge to the right of way. As long as weather and time permits we will conduct ditching and cutting of berms on multiple roads. We have completed crack sealing of asphalt roads and will be spending one day in the very near future filling some holes on the asphalt roads.

For your information only please be aware that there are only three members of the road dept. that try to keep up maintenance on 18 miles of dirt roads and roughly 10 miles of paved. We will never purposely avoid or ignore a road however I would ask that you please contact one of the 2 phone numbers below and kindly advise me if you feel there is something that needs done.

Please leave a message if there is no answer as if I am in operating a machine or driving I will return your call. Please help us help you. This Fall and Winter if you see us grading or dragging, ditching, or plowing please pass us with care and if possible pull off into a drive way. I respectfully ask this because if we stop and lift the blade of the grader, drag and or plow while pushing snow it is difficult for us to resume pushing the material again and adequately continue.

I have made multiple reports with the Sherriff's office in regards to the vandalism on the roads with ATV's. If you see anyone doing damage to the roads please help us by contacting the Law and or call us and we will come see how bad the damage is and try to fix it in a timely matter.

Lastly I would like to clear up some of the questions in regards to the Newcomb Road Paving. This project is being funded and managed by both the State and County. The last information provided to me is that the bidding for the project will be given out in October. I am unsure when the bids will be opened and the work started. Yes, Newcomb road is scheduled to be paved from Shedd Rd south to Rt 168. NO we as the township are not doing it or handling the project however I will be more than happy to try and answer any questions you may have and or attempt to find an answer for you. FYI in the days or weeks coming NEWCOMB ROAD RESIDENTS the speed limit will be changed to 45 MPH prior to the start of the project. I wish the best to everyone and thank you for the continued support and understanding and hope you have a safe and enjoyable fall.

Parkman Township Zoning Inspector

To all Parkman Township residents:

For several years the Board of Trustees and the Zoning Department have been working hand and hand to rid the Township of junk. Junk vehicles, unlicensed vehicles, and noxious weeds, overgrowth and high grass all tends to bring down your property value.

ARTICLE 4 "PROHIBITED USES IN ALL DISTRICTS "

- Section "D" states "storage of junk vehicles"
- Section "E" junk yards: and the storage of junk
- Section "F" automotive wrecking and recycling is prohibited

The Zoning Inspector with written notice will notify the violator and request that they remove the junk or junk vehicle with in thirty days, noting in the letter what section of the code is being violated. The provision of the resolution shall govern the minimum conditions and responsibilities of the property owner, structures, equipment and exterior of your property.

The Goal of the Township is to be JUNK FREE, free of inoperable or unlicensed vehicles on any property in the township. Recently we have cited property owners with steel storage containers. This item is not allowed within the township it is a PROHIBITED within our regulations. 

Parkman Telephone Company

From Mary Ellen Finch Nixon My adopted parents, Frank and Elsie Finch operated the old Parkman Telephone Company.

The Finches worked for the Parkman Telephone Company first time in the 1910 area – then took a job with Ohio Bell in Mantua, Ohio. That is when they adopted me. When that company went to dial, they came back to Parkman as the company was in financial straits due to the operation of the fellow that was hired in the meantime.

My adopted parents, Frank and Elsie Finch operated the Parkman Telephone Company from 1935 until it went to dial. My foster father did all the manual labor with the help of one other fellow. We ALL worked the switchboard. Sorry that I don't have any photos of the switchboard. Wish my father could see the telephones that are in use today.

We lived in the big house at the southeast corner of the gazebo park just off route 422 and the road north to Middlefield, the house was the first one on the east side of the road going south. When I lived there, the telephone exchange was in our house, in the front room on the south of the building, on the main floor.

After dad died, mother operated the company up until the time they went dial and then bought the house. I graduated from Parkman High School in 1940. I lived there until I married in 1947 and then moved to Warren, Ohio.

I now live in Arizona. I am sure that there have been many changes since I lived in Parkman.

Thank you Mary for sharing your story with our Parkman Community. I can only picture the Parkman Telephone Company like a scene from Lilly Tomlin's comic Ernestine the Switch Board Operator. As you said, it is amazing how advance the technology of phones is these days compared to when it began. Happy 98th Birthday from all of us in Parkman!!!

Parkman Fire & Rescue

Earlier this year the 5 mil Fire Levy that was placed on the ballot failed. If this levy would have passed in the Spring of 2020, the Fire Department would have been funded for the next 30 years! To our knowledge, this is the first time that a ballot initiative for



Parkman Fire has failed at the poles. The Fire Department and Township Board of Trustees are actively engaged in the planning of another ballot measure in the spring (May) of 2021. The level of funding to be requested has not been determined nor has the duration of the levy.

WE NEED YOUR INPUT!!! The Fire Department and the Trustees need to hear the voice of the township. Your voice needs to be heard, and can be by Email, phone calls, or by attending a trustees meeting on the first and third Tuesdays of the month at the Parkman Community House. We need to hear what services the township expects from the Fire Department.

We have not seen much of a decrease in requests for assistance due to the pandemic, but the significant incidents for Parkman have increased significantly in the first half of 2020. We have responded to 8 significant fires this year in Parkman, 2 of which required State Fire Investigator assistance due to the nature and cause.

Parkman Fire continues to support our residents and businesses at their time of need, if Parkman is not available, long standing agreements have been solidified, to automatically dispatch additional departments to your emergency further reducing the time it take for assistance to arrive.

Any residents that wish to serve the community as a firefighter or EMT please reach out to us, the community needs your help. In most cases your training is covered by the Fire Department after a criminal history check, drug test, and physical, that are requirements set forth by the State.

You can contact your Trustees, the Fire Department, or the Fire Chief to have your input heard or questions answered.
