# **Parkman Trustees**

Parkman township has an important Road Levy coming up on November 8th. This is a 1.5 mil Continuing Renewal levy. This levy was first approved by the voters in the March 2008 election and renewed by vote every 4 years since then. It won't cost any more on your tax bill. We are making it a continuous levy, so we don't have to keep putting it on the ballot every five years. That does not change the amount you are currently paying. This levy covers materials to keep the Road Department functional and to maintain the roads at the current level. Unfortunately, failure of this levy could result in reduced maintenance on Parkman roads. Be sure to vote on November 8, 2022.

At the Memorial Day celebration, Parkman honored six veterans who graduated from the old Parkman School and also are interred in a Parkman cemetery. We presented plaques to four of the families of those veterans. At the time, we were unable to make contact with the remaining two. Good news! Thanks to the Facebook page, one of those families found us! The family of Herbert Bruce Olmstead contacted us on Facebook and we discovered that a niece and nephew live right here in the area. At the September 6 Trustee meeting, we presented them with a plaque honoring their uncle Bruce. To see the full Memorial Day tribute, read the Memorial Day Parkman Paragraphs on the website. We are putting a new laminate floor in the dining room and kitchen in the Community House. Fisher Flooring of Middlefield will be starting the project on September 12th and it should be finished by the end of the month. The carpet in the meeting room and the stairs will be cleaned. We are also looking into cleaning and refinishing the upstairs floor.

Plans are being drawn up for a lift/elevator to be installed on the back of the Community House with inside access so those with limitations can get to the second floor. We are hopeful that this will lead to more Community House rentals. This project is being paid for by the American Rescue Plan money Parkman received from the federal government.

Members of the Parkman Historical Society and some graduates from Parkman rescued the old bell which was in the original Parkman School. They would like to see it preserved. We are installing the bell from the old Parkman school in a new structure at the Gazebo Park, where it will join the Cromwell stone and The Old Mill Stone. Tim Yoder who donated and constructed the Gazebo will be constructing the structure for the bell.

Special Thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Roger Anderson for all their hard work putting together our new Veteran's Park, it really looks great.

## **Parkman Roads**

I know that people like to know what is going on with the roads in our community. We have a plan, and are working diligently to make them better. It takes a lot of time, planning and good scheduling. Last year we chip sealed a couple of already paved roads. I was asked why. Well, the reason we did this was to seal up all of the cracks and hold the road from completely falling apart.

This year we purchased a road side mower. We did this because in the spring, our other tractor is pulling the road maintainer in order to get the dirt roads ready for dust control. So I feel that it is important that we keep the roads mowed back so that when pull out of your driveway, you can see traffic. We are going to be mowing more frequently, but we are not cutting to the edge of the right of way until the fall.

Right now, we are working on Patch and Nash road, so that we can chip seal them this year. We want these roads chip sealed so that they will hold together better in the spring time. The other reason for that is so that we will not have to spread as much dust control in the spring. This will save us time to focus on other roads.

Please travel slow through our work zones.

# **Parkman Township Zoning Inspector**

Hello Parkman residents:

This is John Spelich your Zoning Inspector for Parkman township, from time to time get questions on this or that and this is one those questions

Why did you revoke my zoning certificate? In SECTION 1100.4 of Parkman Township zoning resolutions a zoning certificate shall be revoked for the following reasons:

A. The certificate was issued in error by the Zoning Inspector.

B. The Zoning Certificate was issued based by a false or untruthful state by the applicant.

C. The construction or use described in the zoning certificate was not begun within six (6) months from the date issued, or the construction has not been completed within two (2) years from date of issuance.

Now keep this information in mind and if any of the above happens call the zoning inspector he is really a forgiving guy.


# Happy 150th Birthday Stella Cromwell October 30th, 2022

Stella Cromwell (born October 30th, 1872) was the wife of William Cromwell. William and Stella both were solid foundations to the Parkman community until her early passing in 1918. In the Fall 2007 edition of the Parkman Paragraphs, you will recall the story about

how William donated land in memory of his wife Stella. The land was deeded to be called the Stella Cromwell Recreation Park and was given to the People of Parkman in 1920.

## Story of the Parkman Mill and Cromwell Stones

The mill stone that was buried in the Parkman Veterans Park downtown was moved there in 1946. The Parkman High School Class of 1946, of which Don Burnett was one of, had a scrap drive like all towns of that time just after the war. It appears that the class made soooo much money that they didn't know what to do. So the whole class went to Detroit, Michigan and still had monies left on their return.

The mill stone was found in a burnout blacksmith shop located just north of Garbers Dry Goods (the 3rd building north of the intersection of 422/528/88). They believe it was there to have new grooves hammered in, probably for the old mill.

Well another class mate, John Turon, had a new tractor and they decided the mill stone needed a new home, so to speak. They picked it up and took it to the park, before they could unload it, Jess Sherwin our one eyed constable, stopped & told them to get it out of here. It's not wanted. Well they just laid it down flat and left. It has been there ever since.

It stayed there for over 75 years until it was moved to the East at Parkman Gazebo Park and stood up in May of 2022. This was part of the redesign of the Parkman Veterans Park.





In addition to the Mill Stone being added to the Parkman Gazebo Park, the Cromwell Stone was also added into the same location. If you recall, the Parkman Paragraphs (Spring 2006 edition) hosted a story about the history of the Cromwell building from Mr. Don George. Some notes from that edition included: The "corner store" had always been the general store and drug store. The Parkman Town Center fire of May 6, 1899, destroyed the store and downtown Parkman. Mr. Cromwell chose to rebuild the store in brick. He reopened on November 7, 1899. Don George's father bought the store in 1939 and stopped the drugstore but put a meat counter in. In 1965, Don & Shirley took over the store and ran it until 1973. It was then sold to Jacque Picard and had apartments added to it. The last business to be in the building (up to 2018) was the Bergs Eye View Embroidery. ODOT purchased the Cromwell building and in 2019, it was torn down to widen the corner radius for semitrucks to turn. The Cromwell stone from the top of the building was added to the Parkman Gazebo Park along with the mill stone. It seemed as a fitting place to honor Mr. Cromwell along with the Parkman Gazebo where the Buckeye Band's performances had regularly occurred.... another story from the Fall 2007 Paragraphs... when the Buckeye Band's baton returned to Parkman and can be seen displayed at our Parkman Community House.
