In 2001, we were tasked as a senior project to invent a website that might enhance the NE Ohio area... so from scratch I accomplished a very basic and simple community website for Parkman. It was a humble idea that taught me very basic website making skills. I passed the class and let it sit in my archives. Later that year I asked the Parkman Trustees Don Villers and Jim Soltis if there was any interest in this project going active. At the time it did not seem needed in our area - not many used computers back then. So it sat in my files until the end of 2003. At that time, I looked into personally hosting the website as a community service project of my own interest. It went active online in January of 2004.

For those who been around and remember, the very first issue of the Parkman Paragraphs was created by Lynn Komandt in June of 2004. She had the ambition to bring a newsletter to our community. Welcome Spring! As I write this column, we are in the midst of a very cold period of subfreezing temperatures. We are looking forward to 40's and 50's and a lot of sunny days. And only as much rain as the farmers need!

Please visit the Pancake Breakfast in March to support the Parkman Chamber of Commerce. They do a spectacular job with the holiday decorations downtown and at the Community House. They also hold some very special events for the kids in our community. They could use your support both in attendance and in volunteering to help with their projects. We are grateful for all that they do for the residents of Parkman.

We are still working on the Gazebo improvements and are hoping to have a dedication of the old school bell installation before Memorial Day. The Gaga Ball Pit at Overlook Park is completed and will be available to play. Related equipment will be provided to renters of the park. Instructions for play are posted. There is a new swing set there as well.

The Community House has new curtains throughout. The old wooden chairs are being rebuilt and strengthened for safety as were the old wooden highchairs. We are investigating new locks and/or keyless entry systems. The elevator is almost done. Only inspections and certifications remain to do as I write this column. A reminder that the elevator has limited usage. It is small, and mainly for the assistance of those with physical challenges, such as those with wheelchairs, walkers, canes, and other difficulties. They can be accompanied by one person. The elevator will be accessible when the second-floor ballroom is part of the rental. We ask that you be sure your guests respect those parameters for use.

Several of the issues that Parkman faced last year have been addressed to the extent possible. The salt-contaminated wells have been identified and new wells have been drilled. The high sewer rates have been balanced out slightly through a tax-related valuation adjustment for 5 years through the Auditor's Office. In 2024, the trustees will continue to work with the Water Resources Department and the County Commissioners to try to improve the functioning of the sewer system.

Talks with the Troy Fire Department on collaboration for services has been halted for now while they reorganize. There are still other avenues to pursue. Our Fire Department coverage is up slightly. The Fire Department is interested in the township providing benefits in order to increase the number of hours that Parkman is covered by Firefighters/EMT's. We will be investigating the financial effects of that plan. It would most likely involve a new levy to support it. Please let your voices be heard regarding this matter. Come to meetings, call, email, ask questions, help us resolve this issue according to your wishes.

Winter conditions are always challenging for road maintenance. Due to rain and snow and freezing temperatures, it is mostly a matter of adding stone and maintaining. Last fall, the township completed chip/sealing Swine Creek Rd, Nash Rd, and Patch Rd. The trustees and the road department are currently working on a plan for this summer's chip/seal project. Follow Parkman Township Facebook page for updates once the plan is finalized.

Last summer's sweltering days with air quality warnings pointed out that we have a need to be filled in our community. The township is working on creating a new committee to oversee a "Warming/ Cooling Center". We are hoping to establish the Community House as a place for weather or power emergencies that do not meet the level of Disaster Centers. The County provides disaster services to every township in case of a major emergency. But, in the situation when a small area is out of power in very hot or freezing weather, the township has hopes to provide a space for residents to warm or cool down for short periods of time. We are calling for volunteers who would like to be part of this effort. We need someone to head this committee. We hope to include the church groups to help provide meals when needed. Please call Henry Duchscherer at 440-858-7848, if you are interested.

We are in need of a couple of residents who would be willing to serve on the Zoning Board or Zoning Board of Appeals. Contact the township telephone or email, or any township official and you will be put in touch with the right person. These phone numbers are available on the website. 200+ years ago in Parkman

In 1795, the Connecticut Land Company bought three million acres of Western Reserve lands from the state of Connecticut . The main purpose of the Connecticut Land Company was the pursuit of profits through the sale of the lands to both land speculators and settlers. Land would usually be sold many times between speculators and investors before it would be sold to someone who would actually settle it. Due to weak land sales, the company was forced to lower prices and give away free land in order to encourage settlement. The problems that forced the company to lower prices ultimately forced the company into bankruptcy.

In 1797, Samuel Parkman, of Boston, took advantage and had purchased shares of the Connecticut Land Company, which constitutes the township of Parkman. Samuel (never visiting the area) sent his nephew Robert Parkman in 1804 to perform a survey and settle the new investment.

Two hundred years ago in 1824, Samuel Parkman died, and his ownership in the unsold land of the township passed to his son, Dr. George Parkman. Robert Parkman continued managing the property and the agency remained unchanged during the life Robert Parkman. Robert Parkman died at the age of sixty-one, after a long illness, March 21, 1832. George Parkman mishandled the investment and in 1835 General Simon Perkins, of Warren, became the new owner, by purchase, of all the remaining Parkman interest, and thus closed all relation with the family who gave their name to the township.

100+ years ago in Parkman

In 1845, Marvin Chapin, built a store on the Moore Garage site, but the building was destroyed by fire soon after it was completed. In 1855, a building of the same size as the Chapin store, was erected by James L. Johnson, the lower part of which, was used by him as a post-office, and shoe store; the upper part was owned by the masonic fraternity, and used by them as a lodge. In 1861, the lower part of the building was purchased by Frederick Holcomb, who enlarged it and occupied it as a store, till 1867. Soon after this, it was owned and used for the same purpose, by Sherburn H. Williams, and William Halstead, under the firm of Halstead & Williams. In 1872, the building and goods were purchased by John L. Moore, and the business continued by him till 1877. It sat vacant for a short time after.



In 1924, a hundred vears ago, W. W. Moore and his two sons, Walter and Robert, came to Parkman and operated a garage and service station in the same building which previously has been used by the Parkman Fire Department. The Moore's had built a lift behind the building to lift new cars onto the second floor as a dealership show case.

In 1939, they purchased the NE corner lot of Main and Market occupied by the Congregational Church (where the Gulf Station is today). The church was moved uphill to its location today and Moore built a new garage. In 1946, he sold it to Standard Oil Company. As mentioned, today it is a Gulf Station.

Parkman Fire Department still has smoke detectors available to residents that have no working smoke detectors. Please call the firehouse during normal business hours at 548-2515 and leave a message if we are unable to answer your call.

In 2023, the Department received 490 requests for emergency responses including: 317 EMS related incidents resulting in 106 transports to local hospitals and 173 fire related incidents.

Please remember to check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors monthly.

If you are interested in serving the community, please stop in the fire house and pick up an application, contact us on Facebook, or call the station. All certification training courses for township residents are fully funded by the fire department.

Hi folks well it looks like we made it through another North east Ohio winter so spring is around the corner and you might be thinking about a spring project such as an addition to your house or garage or a new out building etc, well keep your Zoning officials in mind with your proposed project. We are here to help when it's in your plan.

Call me John Spelich at 330-219-3698 or text me at the same number or the new Parkman Township Zoning Assistant Mark Strumbly at 440-321-6167 or text Mark at the same number. You may know of Mark because he was a zoning Inspector 15 to 20 years ago. Mark is a problem solver Mark knows the lay of the land so to speak. Mark came on board about 6 months ago and he hit the ground running so keep Mark in mind when you start planning a project.

So as a reminder in your plan remember you must submit a site plan (just a simple drawing) showing existing building(s) your house septic system driveway and where your proposed addition, or building is going to be located and your front lot line from the edge of the road or berm (may vary a little) your back lot line and side lot lines all three are 25 feet and the front is 75 feet. The minimums are in section 402.6 (A) &(B) with that call for an appointment and or come to the Zoning office on any Wednesday 4pm to 6pm and complete an application for a permit and Mark or my self with take care of you. If you can't make to hours then call for an appointment.
